Join us for our annual National Public Health Week Symposium when we welcome respiratory health expert John Balmes, MD who will give our keynote lecture on the potential public health effects of climate change. Dr. Balmes leads a research program involving the respiratory effects of ambient air pollutants. In his laboratory at UCSF, he conducts controlled human exposure studies of the acute effects of ozone and other pollutants. At UC Berkeley, he collaborates in epidemiological studies of the chronic effects of air pollutants. He is author of over 200 papers or chapters on occupational and environmental respiratory disease-related topics with many of these dealing with the potential health effects of ambient air pollutants. Dr. Balmes' expertise in the health effects of ambient air pollutants has been recognized by multiple awards.
